Senior Phase Study Support



Study Support Evening Webinars for Senior Phase learners are underway again for the session 2022/2023, with weekly webinars for English, Maths, Sciences and Social Subjects having started in the week beginning September 26th. Other webinars start again in the week beginning October 31st.

Learners have rated the overall quality of our webinars at 4.5 out of 5, and we're very proud of how our teachers create a webinar atmosphere that is relaxed and enjoyable with a real sense of the online 'class' working together on interesting and relevant learning.

Learners can simply 'sit in' and listen to/watch the webinar, or they can choose to interact in the chat and the 'Your Questions' channel - there's no pressure either way. Webinars enhance the learning that is going on in schools, and 99% of learners report that the experience really helps to build their confidence.

Evening webinars are available for over fifty subjects, covering levels from N4 and N5 through to Higher and AH. All webinars are delivered by experienced, GTC registered teachers in Scotland. We have a great team of teachers, and a great range of webinar subjects. There are too many to mention them all - but just to give a flavour, we have webinars in PE, RMPS, Graphic Communication, Applications of Maths, Gaelic, Spanish, Music and many other subjects.

DYW Live

Following a successful second year in 2021/22, with an estimated 130, 000 learner attendances overall, DYW Live is back this session to bring the world of work into the classroom.



There are even more work inspiration webinars, skills sessions, certificated courses, themed weeks and teacher CPD sessions, all free to attend, live and interactive, aligned to areas of economic growth and delivered by partner organisations & companies.

The programme went live on 5th September and already has received more than 120 registrations from teachers in 19 different local authorities across the country.


i-SGOIL OFFER FOR INTERRUPTED LEARNERS


As part of the National e-Learning Offer, e-Sgoil is continuing to develop its provision for learners who have disengaged from their own school setting. The i-Sgoil programme works in partnership with local schools to re-engage learners within an online space offering live, interactive timetabled classes for learners from P2 - S6.


i-Sgoil works in partnership with each learner's school to support each child with their learning. Schools and local authorities are expected to provide learners with a suitable device, headset and connectivity should this be required.

Beginner's English for Ukrainian Families





In May e-Sgoil started online English lessons for Ukrainian families. These lessons were led by Alex Kuryluk, a Ukrainian speaking Scottish teacher who already works here at e-Sgoil, who was ably assisted by a team consisting of language specialist teachers and technical support. These lessons were online, free and available to all families. There were over 400 emails to e-Sgoil asking to register for the classes which resulted in an an average of 70 families joining in each learning session. This included parents with children, couples and individuals from the age of 5 to 65! The learners came from right across Scotland including Shetland, Skye, Millport, Mallaig, Peterhead, Aberdeen, Dundee, Tighnabruaich as well huge swathes of the central belt and down as far as Duns and Hawick.

Not only did the lessons help support learners to integrate into the community better, they were fun and built a sense of comradery amongst participants. All learners reported that after the lesson they were more encouraged to continue to learn and use English. Meet the team



I am currently one of the Digital Depute Head Teachers for e-Sgoil and I am based in Sutherland in the Scottish Highlands. I have been a DHT for 6 years in a local authority school and have a background in teaching History and Modern Studies. My favourite period of History to teach has always been WWI.

My family and I have relocated from Aberdeenshire to the Highlands as I am originally from here (not far from Dornoch) and wanted to return home to be close to family. We love living in such a beautiful and rural area of Scotland.

My role within e-Sgoil is to work alongside the Scottish Qualifications Authority (SQA) to support the delivery of National Qualifications and SQA Awards to young people learning through our i-Sgoil provision. I also lead on Senior Phase curriculum and tracking, monitoring, and reporting on young people's progress. Professionally I am keen to support young people in tracking and celebrating their achievements to support their wellbeing.

My name is Annchris Maclean, I am currently a Gaelic Medium Teacher with e-Sgoil and have been teaching for over 10 years. I currently teach through the Misneachd programme which in English translates to the Confidence programme.

For me personally, e-Sgoil has been a lifeline. Having recently moved back home to Harris, childcare and work were two things I was going to have to choose between. I had come to terms with more than likely having to leave the teaching profession to look after my two young children. However, I was offered a few hours a week teaching through e-Sgoil during the first National Lockdown. This was possible as I would be teaching from home and able to balance teaching with family life. As the weeks progressed, the hours increased,



I found that this online teaching revolution could be the answer for me as a single parent. I now work full time 5 days a week and have the right degree of flexibility to make it possible. I am now back in the GME teaching system, which has given my life meaning and stability to my family, as well as enabling me to contribute to my local economy.
